- **Solving a Good Problem! The Problem.** Our High School youth group has outgrown the present youth room. Currently there about 30 students in the group and that is expected to grow to about 45-50 next school year. **The Solution.** We have received permission from Bishop Vasa to enlarge our current youth room to twice its current size. We have just signed a contract with Mark Holland Construction to expand the room. The project will include removing the west wall of the youth room and adding on to the west of the current youth room. The cost of the project is as follows:

The project will be paid for from available savings.

Consider Liturgy: The opening prayer, also known as the Collect, which follows the Gloria, begins with an invitation: Let us pray. The formula, followed by a pause, is very familiar but what we are to do during this pause may be a bit of a mystery. As noted in the General Instruction: "All, together with the priest, observe a brief silence so that they may be conscious of the fact that they are in God's presence and may formulate their petitions mentally." (GIRM, 54) The term "collect" then makes sense for it is literally the "collection" and summing up of all the prayers of all of the people. If individual participants fail to do their individual 'work' of identifying their own desires and petitions there may be nothing to 'collect'. May God bless you. +Bishop Vasa
