- **Lenten Events**
 - **Fish Fry:** Knights of Columbus will be hosting a Fish Fry each Friday Evening during Lent starting February 19, 2010. Dinner will be served from 5:00-6:30 pm at the Knights of Columbus Hall, 1910 Greensprings Drive. Cost is \$6.00 per person.
 - **Stations of the Cross:** Stations of the cross will be every Friday (except Good Friday) starting February 19, 2010 at 7:00 pm.
 - Copies of Stations of the Cross will be in the vestibule for those who wish to come to church and pray the stations during the daytime. **Please do not take copies home.**
 - **Fast and Abstinence Regulations:** All Catholics 14 years and older must abstain from meat on Fridays of Lent. Meat includes beef, chicken, fowl, pork, and wild game, etc. All Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are to fast on Good Friday. To fast means to eat one full meal; the other two meals that day should be less than the normal amount unless they are already at a minimum for good health. Eating between meals is not permitted; however, liquids including coffee, milk and fruit juices are allowed.
