Consider Liturgy: Liturgical commentators have some very good insights for us: Eamon Duffy writes: "The shift towards an emphasis on the primacy of human religious activity or experience, at the expense of the Latin Missal's relentless emphasis on the activity of God, is a striking feature of the 1973 version." (the present Missal) This is reiterated by John F. Baldovin: "If I were to argue only one point it would be that we need to understand that the liturgy is first and foremost God's act - a gift - and only secondarily something that we do." Through the Liturgy we receive the gift of God's own life. We are brought into the holy communion of the Blessed Trinity, we are divinized. May God bless you. +Bishop Vasa

The Citizens Review Board (CRB) in our community is in need of board member volunteers.

The Citizen Review Board (CRB), a component of the Oregon Judicial Department, is composed of well trained community volunteers. The CRB creates a system of checks and balances in which the community has both input and impact on how the Department of Human Services and Oregon Youth Authority serve the children, youth, and families in Oregon.
