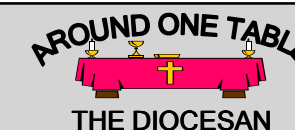

Consider Liturgy: Besides greater accuracy of translation, one of the notable features of the Gloria is the inclusion of a form of litany or repetition. In the present version, for instance, we say: "we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory". Three words are used: worship, thanks and praise. This is in contrast to the five in the new translation: praise, bless, adore, glorify, give thanks. Bless, adore and glorify are all presently absorbed into the single word worship. The future, more faithful translation is much more expressive and expansive. Our praise of God needs to be expansive and effusive. While it is OK to say, God is good. It is much more heart- uplifting to say: God is gracious, kind, merciful, benevolent, true and good.
