They left their nets and followed Him. (Mark 1:18)

In His unending creativity, God calls us to know Him and to serve Him in a way that is unique to each of us. In today's Gospel, we see Jesus calling his disciples to set out on an adventure that challenged their assumptions. They too resisted at times, but eventually became impassioned preachers of the gospel (Mark 1:16-20).
